

TelecomPioneers 911 Simulator - Teaching the Value of Emergency Assistance

What is a 911 Simulator?

The 911 Call Simulator is a unit that recreates dial tone, ringing, and creates a talking path when a student correctly dials 911. It was developed by Pioneers to assist fire fighters, emergency services personnel, police officers, teachers and others in instructing children and adults how to call for emergency assistance by duplicating the exact process experienced during a real 911 call.



Real Life Lessons!

The 911 Call Simulator helps students realize this is not a game, but a real life lesson on how to place an emergency call. This educational simulation also relieves apprehensions of a future actual call.



How Does The 911 Simulator Work?

- v The Student dials 911. If dialed incorrectly a warning buzzer sounds.
- v If dialed correctly the phone of the “Operator” rings.
- v The Operator answers with the same response as a 911 Call Center and asks pertinent questions.
- v If caller hangs up prematurely the Operator can call the student back.
- v Upon receiving sufficient information, the caller can initiate a siren with the Professional and Executive Models.
