HOT Trikes are made and distributed by the New Outlook Crossroads Chapter of the **TelecomPioneers**. The chapter has been making the trikes since 1982 and in that time has delivered trikes to more than 10,000 children.



## How Much Does A Hot-Trike Cost?

There are two styles of HOT Trikes. The trike with the standard tricycle seat is \$115. The style with a bucket or safety seat is \$145. The safety seat comes with a fastening strap for children who might have difficulty sitting in place on a standard seat.
